1. Minutes of Previous Meeting

The Minutes of the last meeting were read and signed as correct.

2. Matters Arising

Mr Woollard reported that the annual cash contribution for Reach towards grass cutting has been estimated at £110.

3. Reach Fair

The Chairman reported that he had been approached seeking permission for Clayhythe Boat Club to bring boats up the Lode during May Bank Holiday. It was unanimously agreed that we should encourage activities of this nature to ensure the Lode is kept open.

4. Cambs Structure Plan

The Clerk read out a letter from CCC (2.1.79) stating that the County Council had approved the Structure Plan for submission to the Secretary of State. However, Mrs Cook advised that East Cambs DC had placed written objections and suggested that we should take up the offer of free copies of "The written Statement (Jan 1979)" and "Supplement to the Report of Survey".

5. Planning Applications

Planning Ref: E/0018/79/D (Mr Wheaton) was discussed and no objections were made.

6. Cheques

The following cheques were authorised and signed: J. T. Reed (tree stakes etc) £34.80, Petty Cash £5.00.

7. AOB [Any Other Business]

Mrs Harrison stated that public refuse had not been collected recently and Mrs Cook agreed to take the matter up with Mr Townsend on 5.2.79.

8. Condition of Footpaths (repairs)

It was agreed that the Clerk should write to Mr Kisby stating that since the recent adverse weather, the footpaths have suffered substantial damage and asking whether repairs can be effected as soon as possible. Mention should also be made of the new road across Fair Green, ie enquiring if any further development has taken place.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting closed.
