Parish Council News

We have an almost unbroken record of coming last in our section of the Best Kept Village Competition. Would everyone take a critical look at their properties, with the aim of giving the village a face lift? So often very little work transforms overgrown gardens and dilapidated exteriors. Efforts are being made to tidy up the Chapel and the Parish Council have accepted 50 trees for autumn planting at the following sites:

around the new cemetery (10 Limes)
between Ditchfield and the railway bridge (6 hornbeam)
on the village green (Beech, 2 near the Dyke, 2 either side swings)
on the Drying Green (2 Silver Birch, 2 Cherry)
along the Hythe (15 assorted)
at the end of Chapel Lane (1 Birch)
on private properties (10)

Help with planting would be welcome and it has been suggested that local children, perhaps working in pairs, should 'adopt' trees to ensure *Tegular watering. We hope the water situation will have improved by then:

The proposed alteration of the Village Green, involving the replacement of the bisecting road by another at the Dyke End, has been approved by the Parish Council and in outline, by the County Council - providing that funds can be allocated. Opinions on this project would be welcomed by the magazine.

There have been some requests for a 30 m.p.h. speed limit through the village. Air your views in the magazine!

REACH RECIPE - ICE CREAM

You will need: $\frac{1}{2}$ can evaporated milk

3 level tablespoons castor sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla essence

teaspoon powdered gelatine

1 tablespoon hot water

Method

- 1. Set the refrigerator at the coldest setting
- 2. Pour evaporated milk into ice tray or small loaf tin
- 3. Stir in the castor sugar and vanilla essence
- 4. Dissolve the powdered gelatine in the hot water over a gentle heat.
- 5. Stir into the milk
- 6. Place in the freezing compartment and leave until crystals begin to form.
- 7. Turn into basin and beat until stiff
- 8. Pour back into ice tray and freeze
