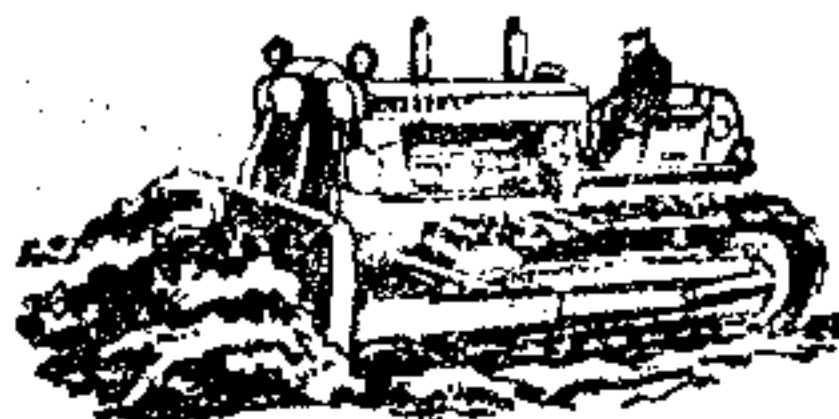

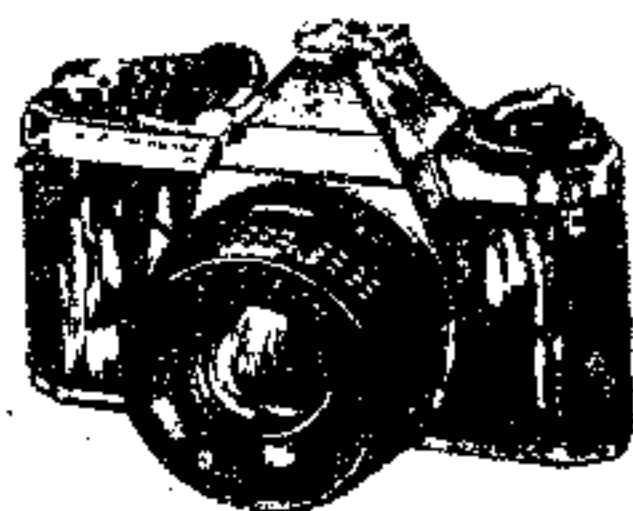

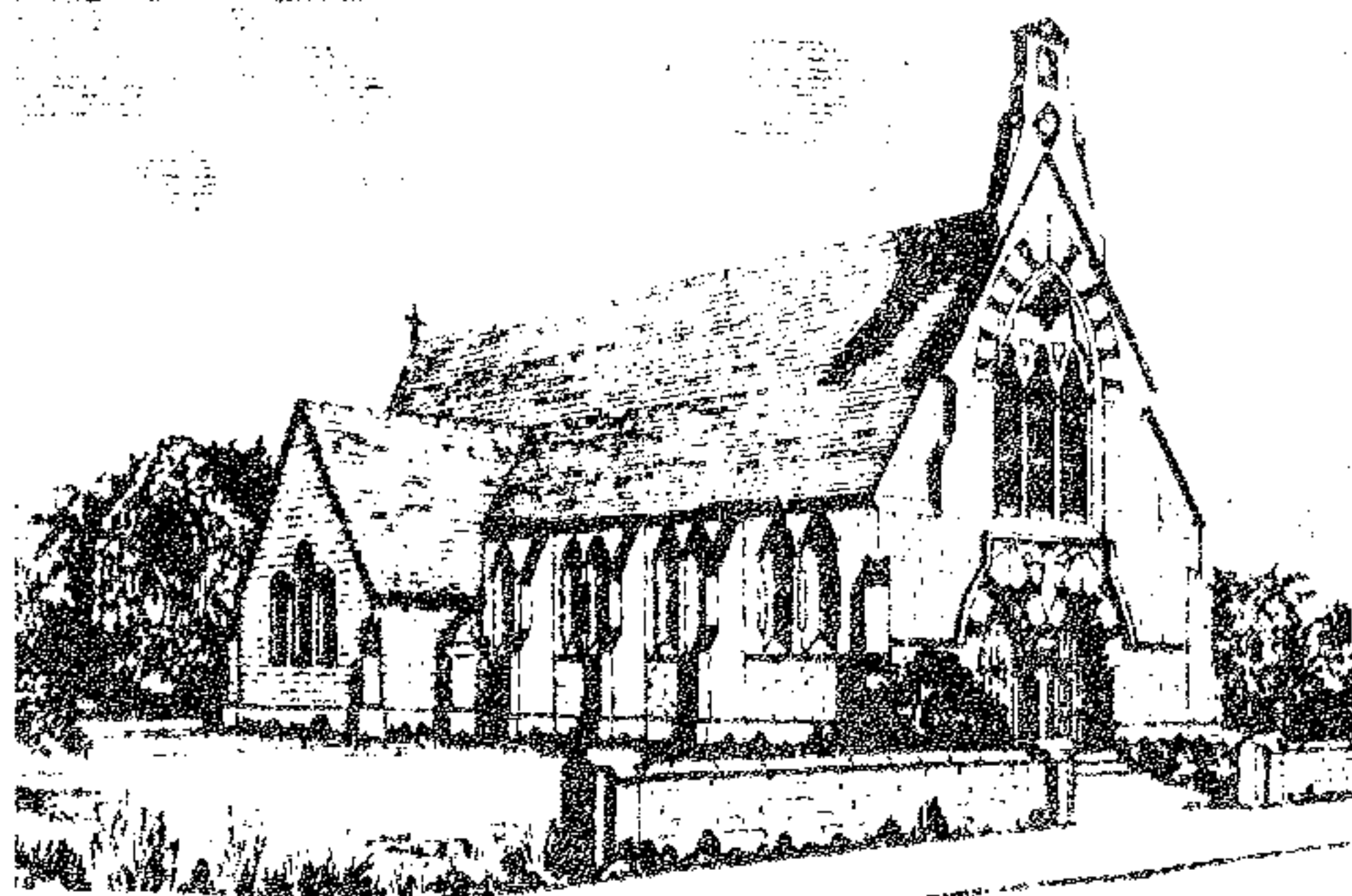

### FROM THE VICAR

First, may I thank the Editor for her kind remarks and good wishes last month. I am now creeping about again in a rather tentative way, hoping complete recovery won't be too long delayed.

By way of a change I thought you might wish this month to hear of a rather important offer St. Mary's Parochial Church Council has recently received from the Historic Buildings and Monuments Commission for England, namely of a grant of £10,738 towards a total bill of just over £26,000 for the repair of the aisle and chancel roofs of St. Mary's. This is conditional on the offer being taken up by 22nd September.

St. Mary's is not wealthy, and its very modest available reserves fall far short, something like £11,000 short of being able to close the gap between the proposed grant and the total cost of the repairs envisaged. Further grants might total as much as £3,500, still leaving us, however, with more than £7000 to find.

Maintaining fabric is a troublesome business, and one sometimes wonders why one spends so many anxious hours wearing one's life away in an apparently endless quest. In our case, however, one has to see the problem in its historic perspective, and remember that this latest project is one of the last stages in the final restoration of St. Mary's which began as long ago as 1878 when the nave had lain open to the sky for over 70 years, since the fall of the spire in 1802.

So my feeling is, and I am speaking personally now, not as Chairman of the P.C.C., that we ought to take up this offer if we possibly can, and hand on the church in as sound a condition as we can to the coming generation. I will try to let you have more definite news later.

### This month's recipe

### MELTING MOMENTS

2½ozs S.R. Flour	½ tspn. vanilla essence
1½ozs Castor Sugar	Glace cherries
2ozs Margarine	Rollod oats and desiccated coconut

Cream margarine & sugar together, add vanilla essence. Stir in flour and mix thoroughly. Divide mixture into 20 pieces, roll each into a ball with wet hands and coat with rolled oats and desiccated coconut. Place on greased baking tray, press out slightly and place a small piece of cherry in the centre of each biscuit. Bake in moderate oven 325°-350° F, Gas 3-4 for 15-20 mins. Leave to cool slightly, then place on cooling tray.
