



# St. Etheldreda and the Holy Trinity Reach

## FROM THE VICAR

A fascinating article has just appeared in a journal I take on the subject of Televised Worship and the Pastoral Ministry by J.G.Davies, Prof. of Theology at B/ham University. He has in mind the growing number of Christians in England who, realising clearly that the breaking of the bread is the centre and spring of the church's mind and life, try to make a point of watching a eucharist on Sunday whenever one is televised, which is increasingly frequently, but are nevertheless prevented from making their communion by the fact of beibg house-bound. As a BBC producer has said, 'the point to which the liturgy is moving, the climax of the event itself, is the moment when TV viewers are left most stranded and aware of their isolation'.

So the problem is, What to do? As so often in the past century, the solution has been found by going back to the practice of the early church. E.G., we know that 'from the 2nd century onwards communion at home by the private individual was permitted'. Justin Martyr, who taught at Rome, and was executed in 165 after being denounced as a Christian, said in his first Apology, or Defence of the Faith, written about 151 A.D. - (he's describing what happened at an early eucharist) - 'those whom we call deacons give to each of those present to partake of the bread and the wine mixed with water over which the thanks-giving was pronounced, and they carry away a portion to those who are absent.'

The famous Roman lawyer, Tortullian, who died about 220 A.D. takes us further by making it plain that what we call 'reservation of the Blessed Sacrament' in private houses was by then the normal custom: i.e., not only did people make their communion in their homes, if it was brought to them by the local deacons, but they were allowed to keep a small quantity of the consecrated bread and wince in their homes for the purposes of communion when threy wanted it.

Even more detailed and fascinating are some remarks by another influential writer or the Roman church of the early 3rd century, Hippolytus, the author of the Consecration prayer which is at the root of all our modern services: 'let every one of the faithful', he says, 'be careful to partake of the eucharist before he eats anything else... for it is the Body of Christ and not to be thought lightly of'. He goes on to speak of the equal care required with the cup of wine which incidently is blessed by the communicant himself, and consumed after receiving the sacred bread'. It is interesting to know that the sacrament was kept in a little box, known as an 'arca', i.e., a secret, special box, some of which have actually been found in the Roman catacombs, lying on the breasts of the dead.

'The application of all this', Prof, Davies says, to televisodd Communion services at the present day is relatively simple, since what is proposed could be regarded both as a continuation of the practice of the early church and an extension or addition to the pastoral ministry already being exercised in the form of home celebrations or of communion from the reserved species. The local minister, knowing that a TV transmission is to take place, and having compiled a list of those wishing to communicate but unable to be present at church, has only to take or arrange for the delivery beforehand of the reserved sacrament so that it may be consumed at the same time as the act of communion in the church building witnessed on the screen. This would be in accordance with the early church precedent, and is theologically justifiable. It could well become a normal feature within the exercise of the pastoral ministry.

This last point, about joining with those who are communicating in the church being televised, is, of course, an important part of the re-discovery of the meaning of true eucharistic life which has been going on now for the past sixty years: the fact that the eucharist is not a private, but essentially a corporate act, an act of the whole church gathered together, so that the act of communion is a sign not only of communion with Christ but with each other.

And one last, very interesting point. The BBC has been giving thought to that now large element in our life who like to watch such services, but are not communicants. They have therefore produced a book called This is the Day specially for such people, which includes a ser on, a meditation, and the breaking of the bread, this last action being regarded as a symbolic gesture of fellowship.

This sounds a bit strange, but is all suddenly made sense of when we are reminded of the custom in the Orthodox Church whereby the celebrant, before the service begins,

sets aside a certain quantity of bread and blesses it, so that it can be consumed afterwards by non-communicants or by non-Orthodox visitors, so as to provide an element of participation and fellowship.

I commend these thoughts to you.





### This Month's Recipe

## Savoury Cheesecake

Crush the crackers. Melt the  $1\frac{1}{2}$  oz fat, add the biscuit crumbs, then press the mixture against the sides and base of an 8 inch ovenproof flan dish. Grate the cheese Cream the 3 oz fat with the scasonings. Separate the eggs. Add the yolks to the seasoned butter, then the cheese and cream. Finally, add whichever flavouring you want and the stiffly beaten egg whites. Spoon the mixture into the lines dish and bake at Mark 1 - 2, 275-300 deg in the centre of oven for about 1 hour, until firm. Serve either her or cold, toped with sliced cucumber and peanuts.
