10	Accident arising from facilities e.g. jumps, mounting block, fencing and gate	Injury to riders and horses, and possibly others, arising from an accident	High	Regular check and log of all amenities e.g. jumps, mounting block, fencing and gate; Professional construction and installation of jumps; Regular maintenance of facilities; and Advice to riders contained in Terms and Conditions and Guidelines for Use of Arena	Low
